

Livestock Show Rules

- ✓ Beef, goats, sheep, dairy and swine animals are subject to registration, which must be verified by agent or teacher. Registration numbers must be shown on entry form and sent to livestock chairman by **October 1, 2022**.
- ✓ Livestock brought to fair barn without proper entry form and health papers will not be accepted.
- ✓ Livestock entries may be removed from barn after show.
- ✓ All entries will be classified immediately upon arrival at barn. Classification cannot be changed except with the specific approval of the Chairman of the Livestock Committee.
- ✓ Each entry must be owned by the exhibitor on or before September 1st of the current year showing.
- ✓ Contestants must be present at time of showing.
- ✓ Dairy, beef, goat, sheep, and swine must be shown by a bona fide FFA or 4-H member. Pre-club children, 9 years and younger, are also encouraged to participate. Must be at least 7 years of age to show swine.
- ✓ Does and wethers will show separately in goat show. Ewes and wethers will show separately in sheep show.
- ✓ The Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage to any animal, but it will give good care and attention to prevent loss or damage.
- ✓ All premiums for livestock awards will be paid by the Livestock Committee behind the stage following the shows.
- ✓ Exhibitors are prohibited from staying overnight in the barn.
- ✓ Where there is not adequate competition in an established class, whether to award first place blue ribbon and money will be the decision of the judge.
- ✓ No exhibitor may enter more than two entries in any one class except goats, sheep, and commercial entries.
- ✓ No commercial herd advertising.
- ✓ Animals will be placed in barn at the discretion of the Livestock Chairman.
- ✓ No boar or beef bull classes.
- ✓ Entry Fee - \$10.00 per animal.
- ✓ Beef must have neck ropes and halters.
